Message

from the President and Chairperson of the Board

TTCU's vision statement is "Enriching lives through financial leadership." That's kind of a fancy way of saying, "we're here to help."

In 2018, "help" meant putting resources into reaching members where they are—online and in person—to provide better service, greater convenience and more tools to help them reach their financial goals.

In May, we opened a beautiful, modern branch in the historic Philcade Building in downtown Tulsa. At 5th and Boston, we're just around the corner from the old Central High School where a handful of teachers founded the credit union in 1934. For members who work or live downtown, the new branch provides a convenient location and work-friendly hours.

We transitioned our branch staffing to Credit Union Advisors (CUA). Now, when members visit a TTCU branch, one person can assist them from start to finish with everything from simple transactions, to share certificates, to more complex business such as auto or consumer loans. Our CUAs also receive training to become Certified Financial Counselors able to create meaningful and personalized plans to help members meet their individual goals.

We purchased land in Oklahoma City and Edmond where we will build two new branches to serve our neighbors and members down the turnpike.

Last fall, we introduced TTCU's new CashBack card. Now members can choose the credit card option that best serves their goals and lifestyles.

We made it easier to open accounts online. The improved software streamlines the process, making it faster and simpler than ever before.

We launched an updated Money Manager, an online tool to help members stay on track with their finances. Members can create a budget, keep an eye on all of their accounts and manage their spending—all in one place.

"Help" is the greatest service we can offer. Financial knowledge empowers members to achieve their goals whether that's taming credit card debt, saving for a child's education, buying a new home or building a nest egg in case of hardship or unexpected expenses. Every member's goals are unique—and it is our privilege to help each member along the way.

We are proud to meet our members where they are—and enrich their lives by offering them financial leadership they can trust.






Total Assets




Return on Assets




Gross Loan Volumes

Community

TTCU's guiding principle is **concern for community**. It's something we take to heart. Our members are our neighbors and friends. From walking in community parades to helping our members reach financial success, TTCU is proud to live in the communities we serve.

Project School Supplies began more than a decade ago. With the help of our generous members and employees, we have equipped more than 60,000 northeastern Oklahoma students in need with essential school supplies.

Kids' Fishing Day is an annual TTCU tradition. Putting more than 600 fishing poles in the hands of children makes for a heartwarming and rewarding day.

For the third consecutive year, TTCU was named a Tulsa Area United Way Trailblazer. Working with Tulsa Regional STEM Alliance, TTCU employees participated in the Inaugural Back to School STEM Expo. The event engaged students with hands-on experiments and activities.

FoolProof, our financial literacy program supporting financial education, is offered free of charge to schools throughout northeastern Oklahoma. Since its inception, more than 1,100 educators, 350 schools and 93,000 students have participated.

Fanning out across northeast Oklahoma each fall, our employees welcome educators and support staff back to the classroom. Through a combination of sponsorships, contributions and our School Pride® Card program, TTCU donated more than a half million dollars to area schools in 2018.

TTCU welcomed 31 new affiliated groups in 2018, including Coldwell Banker, Triad Eye Institute and the Philbrook Museum of Art.
